Organization's Name Gets a New Look

The Open Door/Cape Ann Food Pantry has trimmed its name to The Open Door with the tag line, "Feeding people. Changing lives."

"The Open Door/Cape Ann Food Pantry name came to be when the two original programs merged in 1986," said The Open Door's executive director, Julie LaFontaine. "The length of the name became unwieldy, and it didn't reflect the full range of programs we offered."

The name-change process took more than a year. During the past twelve months, clients, volunteers and donors were polled for words that they felt represented the heart and work of the organization.

"The results of the polling made it clear that our identity was about the tangible work of providing food and feeding people," said LaFontaine, "But, it was more than that. Words such as hope, help, care, and change showed up over and over."

Armed with survey results and the donated talent and time of a creative team at Mullen, The Open Door got a brand new look. Mullen's expertise helped give birth to this new brand.

"Our clients, donors and volunteers can be assured that the shorter name does not mean that we are offering fewer services," said LaFontaine. "In fact, people can use the Food Pantry once every seven days during these tight economic times."

The Open Door programs have served residents of Gloucester, Rockport, Essex, Manchester, and Ipswich for more than 30 years. Visit www.foodpantry.org for more information.

Mobile Market Opens in Ipswich

The Open Door Mobile Market at Agawam Village was launched on Tuesday, July 7. Mobile Markets provide qualified households with a weekly distribution of fresh produce and nutrition education which includes cooking demonstrations and recipes.

The Open Door Mobile Market started in 2005 and now serves three locations in Gloucester: Pathways (134 households), Riverdale Park (90 households), Willowood (60 households); and Kitefield Road, Rockport (24 households); and Agawam Village, Ipswich (150 households).
